But the dream of genuinely paper-free travel has come one step closer now that a Scottish team has designed a virtual boarding pass for use with mobile phones and handheld devices.

Iain McCreedy, chief executive of Mobiqa, one of the firms behind the technology, says, "Virtual-ticketing technologies are already being used extensively in the rail transport and live events sectors, and their use within the aviation sector is the next logical step."

The technology will be officially launched and demonstrated at the Passenger Terminal Expo in Barcelona this month.
